Students will sit 2 exams for English Literature. Students have studied a range of texts which they will be examined on across both exams.

Being familiar with the texts is very important and we would encourage all students to read and re-read the books they have studied. Students are also required to include quotations in their answers, despite not having the books in front of them in the exam. It is therefore vital that they have memorised some key quotes from all of the texts. The key quote lists are available here.

The workbooks we have provided them with include helpful revision activities for both English Language and English Literature and the timetable below directs them to relevant pages of this for Literature revision.

It is also very helpful for students to practise by timing themselves when completing exams to help build stamina and also encourage them to complete the paper within the time limit.
