The Omission Apos	strophe				
Used to join words together to show that there are letters missing.					
Examples:	I am = I'm	do not = don't			
	did not = didn't	will not = won't			
Possessive Apostr	ophe				
Used to show that something belongs to somebody or something.					
Example: The boy's bedroom was a complete mess.					
When the name already ends in 's' you can place the apostrophe after the 's'					
Example: Mrs Jones' son was a policeman.					
If you are referring to a group of people that something belongs to you can place					
the apostrophe after the 's'					
Example: The	e teachers' meeting.				
Its and It's					
If you are not sure whether to use its or it's, try replacing the word with "it is" or					
"it has" to see if the	sentence still makes	sense. If you can, you need to	use "it's"		
if not you need "its"					
Examples:	Its a wonderful day.	x It's a wonderful day. $$			
	It's bone was gone.	x Its bone was gon	ıe. √		

Teaching Ideas:

Hand students a subject specific paragraph with the possessive apostrophes missing. Students add in the missing apostrophes.

Hand out a list of subject specific sentences and ask students to rewrite the words that could be combined using an omission apostrophe.

Read out examples of sentences containing "it's and its" and students should use their traffic light cards to vote on which version is correct (thumbs up for "it's" and thumbs down for "its")

CBSC - Parent help sheet

Logging in on a browser on your computer or laptop

To log in to School Gateway as a parent, follow the steps below:

- 1. Visit our school website and click on Quick links
- 2. Then select the SCHOOL GATEWAY option it will take you to this website
- 3. Select the tab for 'NEW USER'
- 4. Enter the email address and the mobile number that the school has for you
- 5. Click on send PIN
- 6. This will generate a 4 digit pin number that will be sent in a text message to your mobile
- 7. Now select the tab for 'EXISTING USER' and enter your email address and the 4 digit pin number.
- 8. Click on the 'LOGIN' button

<u>Please note</u>: If you have other children then the email address/mobile number you have registered with us must be the same if you want the accounts to merge.

Logging in on the app on your mobile phone

If you have a smart phone you can download an app called 'School Gateway'.

Simply navigate to your App store or go to either: <u>www.schoolgateway.com/apple</u> (This will take you to iTunes) Or <u>www.schoolgateway.com/android</u> (This will take you to Google Play)

The instructions to help you set up the App are clear once it has been downloaded.

Logging in on a browser on your computer or laptop

To log in to Show My Homework as a parent, follow the steps below:

- 9. Visit our school website and click on Quick links
- 10. Then select the HOMEWORK option it will take you to this website
- 11. Click I've been given a PIN or Parent code to get into my account
- 12. Enter your code if you do not have your code or need your password reset please email pbrittain@carshaltonboys.org
- 13. Tick *I am not a robot* and complete any security tasks if necessary
- 14. Click Submit
- 15. On the next screen, add your contact details and choose a password. Press Update details when you're done.
- 16. Your account is now set up. Moving forward you can access your account using your email and password combination.

Logging in on the app on your mobile phone

To log in on your phone via the Show My Homework app for iOS or Android, follow the steps below:

- 1. Search for your child's school (by name or postcode)
- 2. Tap Log in with a PIN or parent code
- 3. Enter your PIN in the empty field
- 4. On the next screen add your contact details
- 5. You can also add your mobile number by tapping *Mobile number* if would like to user your mobile number to recover your login details
- 6. Tap Update Profile
