
# Year 9 Assembly - WaterAid

It also encouraged them to be reflective of the simple things that we take for granted.






## RMetS Climate Change Conference 9th March 2017

In his presentation Peter sensitively outlined the position of his charity, who seek to provide support to women who are pregnant as an alternative to abortion, as well as explore reasons for, and the argument in favour of, a woman's right to have an abortion.
